



Expectations

- Do not be alone or ride in a vehicle with a person of the opposite sex at any point in a ministry context while serving at Rocky Creek.
- Do not develop an emotional or sexual relationship with a student or any adult in your ministry area.
- Protect your ministry and reputation by using all computers, cell phones, and technology in a godly manner.
- Always have parental consent before taking any student on any outing sponsored by the church.
- Be a servant leader by being willing to do menial tasks and by being a team player beyond your assigned tasks.
- Take initiative and learn to work without close supervision.
- If anyone confides in you regarding any kind of crime or abuse, you must report that immediately.
- Dress appropriately for the task you are assigned to do. Your immediate ministry supervisor will help determine appropriateness.
- Support the work of the church and the entire staff. If you cause disunity, you will be asked to step down from your leadership role or task.
- Intentionally build relationships with students and leaders. Be sensitive to those who are new or not included. Work to bring those who are left out into meaningful friendships with others.
- Understand that anything posted on social media sites can be seen by students, parents, and leaders. There is a high standard for those serving in leadership roles in which we refrain from alcohol, smoking, and inappropriate behavior. You will be asked to step down if your example could cause a weaker brother to stumble or to fall into patterns of addiction.
- Do not bully or prank any student or any adult.
- Support and respect all adults, including parents, leaders, and staff.
- Keep all information shared between staffers, ministers, students and families confidential. Issues and problems can be shared with the ministry staff, but confidential information shared outside of the staff circle will result in dismissal from your assignment.
- If at any time you struggle with an addiction or moral failure, ask for help immediately to be able to protect yourself and your future ministry.
