

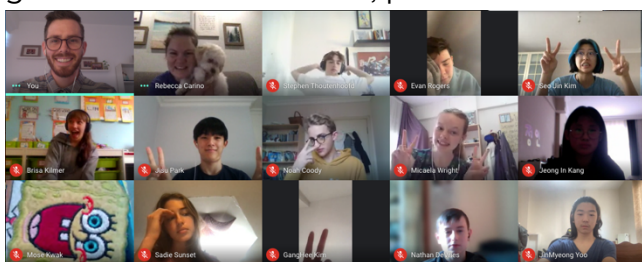


**May Missions Prayer Newsletter**
